For your convenience, Marathon Township accepts credit / debit cards. Visa, MasterCard, and Discover cards will be assessed a 2.5% convenience fee by Chase Bank.

Burn Permits- Lapeer County has installed a new burn permit system. In order to obtain a burn permit, you will now go to [www.marathontwp.com](http://www.marathontwp.com), click on the burn permit link and fill out the form. Your burn permit will then be emailed to you for your convenience. The permits are still good for a full 30 days. Any updates to your permit such as it being canceled due to a burn ban will now be emailed to you or sent as a text message. We will no longer be able to call and notify you when this happens. This is a great new system as you will be much more informed and you will no longer need to plan ahead to get a permit when we are open. Anytime you decide to have a fire you can now fill out the form online and you are ready to go for the next 30 days. You will also find it is no longer necessary to keep your permit current every month; spur of the moment fires can be handled quickly and easily online.
